## Oasis 3 Types of Attenders

As we continue to meet, it has become clear that three basic types of people are showing up;

Observers: are happy to do and give nothing but just came to watch the show each week, not unlike the people who hit the brakes when driving past a nasty wreck and gaze and grin.

Consumers: likewise give and do nothing, but are always wanting more and making demands for more goods and services from the church.

Participants: a handful of people who have bought into the idea of the church being a missionary to our city. They come to church seeking a way to serve a greater mission and are enormously encouraging.

## *Tri-perspectival questions we ask regarding ministry involvement...*

In viewing ministry from a tri-perspectival worldview (prophet, priest and king) these are the questions we ask as we work through ministry opportunities.

1. What is the purpose/goal/vision of the ministry? Do these goals agree with the Bible? Are those involved in the ministry aware of the theological convictions guiding their ministry? Have we taught on these areas as needed?
2. Is the ministry grace centered? What is the motivational structures people use to serve in the ministry? Is it the gospel? Does the ministry take the needs of the people into account?
3. What people, systems, resources does the ministry need? What needs to happen to improve the ministry? What development, training or other coaching would benefit the people involved?
